Slow roast beef carved into a giant Yorkshire pudding served with roast potatoes, seasonal vegetables and pan gravy

Trip details

Trip 1

Time will be limited at the National Coal Mining museum. It is unlikely there will be time to do both of the tours and see any of the large site. The underground tour has been closed for several years and is not guaranteed to be available but if anybody really wants to do it, we will see what we can do, but suggest you pay for it on the day.

Then on to Cannon Hall farm which has some excellent restaurants for lunch. There may also be an opportunity to look round Cannon Hall itself but we are unsure if it will be open that late in the year.

Trip 2

On our way to the “International Bomber Command Centre” the coach will do a drive past of the spectacular “Bomber County Gateway Memorial” newly completed and standing higher than the Angel of the North. There is guided tour at the IBCC and a great cafe for lunch

On to the cathedral, a tour of the ground floor is included in the entry fee and takes 70 mins. The rooftop tour is extra and numbers are limited to 14, though there should be time to run two tours if there is the demand – takes 1hour 45 minutes. Anybody that doesn’t fancy the cathedral can explore Lincoln instead but you must be back for the coach leaving time as it’s a long walk back to the hotel!!

All Sunday trips are via own transport

After the farm visit there are a number of beautiful walks in the area (depending on mother nature) and some other places to visit. It will be a see how it goes on the day we think

There are of course several stately homes and other possible visits around the hotel if you are looking for something to do on the Monday. We will compile a list ready for the weekend
